

## The Ardhowen Accessible Seating Plan

**It is important to make staff aware of your requirements when booking to ensure they can offer you the best available seat.**



### **Wheelchair User**

- There are 3 accessible spaces in Row C, Seats 1-2, 3-4, 5-6 in the Auditorium.
- Companions will be able to sit beside a person in this row if only two accessible spaces are used on the night.
- If three accessible spaces are needed, a companion will be able to sit in Row C, Seat 6 and two others will be able to sit in Row D behind the wheelchair user.

### **Person with physical disabilities**

- Row C, Seats 7-16 are the most suitable seats for people with poor mobility, as there are no steps.
- If the user is able to climb one step with a handrail, they could sit in Row D, Seats 1- 10.



### **Deaf or Hard of Hearing**

- The 'T' Feature Hearing Aid Inductive Loop System works best in Rows C, D, E & F.
- If you wish to lip-read, Row A, Seats 5-18, Row B, Seats 8-21 and Row C, Seats 9-25 are closest and most central.



## Visual Impairment

- If you need a seat where there are no steps, Row C, Seats 9-24 are most accessible and central.
- If you do not mind using steps, Row A, Seats 5-18 and Row B, Seats 8-21 provide the closest and most central viewpoint.

- If you need to take breaks or have the option to leave the Auditorium quickly Row J Seats 1-4 and 31- 34 and Row H Seats 1-4 and 31-35, are the most suitable seats.
- These seats will allow you to exit the Auditorium from the back doors into the Upper Foyer area.



## Assistance/ Guide Dog

- A Patron and his/her Assistance/Guide Dog can be positioned in an end of row seat.
