Children and Young People

Inter-linkage Programme for existing Youth Groups

A programme designed to maximise sustained cross community membership and build the capacity of young people aged 11-18 years through shared activities.

Resilience-based Programme for Young People

A programme designed to improve mental health and well-being targeted at young people aged 11-24 years. This programme will address common issues such as cyber bullying, suicide awareness and substance abuse.

Cross Community Social Action/Volunteering Programme

A programme designed to develop citizenship skills for young people aged 14-24 years.

Language Support Programme

An English language support programme for young people from Black, Minority, Ethnic (BME) and Newcomer Communities, to include intergenerational conversation circles to establish community connections.

Cross Community Cultural Activity Programme – Creative Cafés

A programme where children and young people will engage in peace and reconciliation themed activities, incorporating, for example, music, arts, multi-media, drama and history.

Cross Community/Cross Border Youth Sports Programme

A programme aimed at establishing minority sport/ youth clubs targeted at children and young people who wish to participate in non-traditional sporting activities.



Shared Spaces and Services

Re-imaging Programme for Existing Spaces

A capital programme that aims to provide up to 25 community groups/organisations with the opportunity to access investment in programmes that will encourage and promote the use of existing spaces on a shared basis. Participating groups will avail of a small resource allocation of up to £8,000 to re-image their facility with a view to making the space more inclusive.

Youth Focused Shared Space Programme

A capital programme aimed at developing and enhancing areas or buildings in the district to become youth focused shared spaces. Anticipated one project per District Electoral Area (DEA).

Flags and Emblems Programme

A programme aimed at addressing the use of flags and emblems to demarcate space on a single community basis and to work with communities to explore other ways of celebrating cultural diversity/identity.

Cross Community Garden Improvement Scheme

A programme designed to enhance up to 10 community gardens/allotments to encourage their use on a cross-community basis. Up to £2,000 small scale capital improvement scheme will be available to participating groups.









Building Positive Relations

Cross Community/Cross Border Inter-linkage Programme

A programme designed to maximise cross community and cross border engagement.

Roots to our Routes: A programme designed to work with up to eight communities, four along the proposed Blueways on the Cavan/Fermanagh border and four along the former railways around the Carrickmore/Sixmilecross/Beragh/Omagh area which will focus on shared heritage through arts, culture, leisure and music based activities.

Folk Traditions: A programme exploring and gathering the oral history of folk traditions in the area with a particular focus on the Mummers. The programme will seek to archive, explain and introduce uniquely Fermanagh/West Tyrone traditions to new audiences.

A Cross Community Intergenerational 'Community Lives' Programme

A programme focusing on housing estates dating back to the 1950s. The programme which will target two estates in Enniskillen town and two estates in Omagh town, will have three interrelated strands; Capturing the history, Mapping the present and Imagining the future.

Cross Community Diversity Programme

A programme designed to increase participation, representation and a sense of 'belonging' in members from Black, Minority, Ethnic (BME), Newcomer, Travelling and LGBT Communities. The programme aims to strengthen relations between those from different cultural backgrounds.

Cross Community Twinning Programme

A programme for sporting clubs in the district to promote their facilities and encourage the formation of new relationships around the shared interest of sport. A small resource allocation of up to £750 is available for participating clubs.

Cross Community Resource Pack and App

Development of a Resource Pack and App which will map and detail the history of the Fermanagh and Omagh district in the context of the Troubles/the Conflict and pinpoint areas of significance such as monuments and memorials.
