	Bridge Street, Omagh Matthew presented the group with an image of the new Bridge Street area. Dermot informed members that the renovations looked positive and that he particularly welcomed the removal of the cobbles.	
	Insert Update: Action 1: Officers are investigating which department has responsibility for the Riverside Walkway. Once the organisation has been identified, officers will raise the possibility of replacing the kerbing with them. Action 2: New PASS form has been sent to local groups and displayed at Council venues. Training for staff on priority queuing will take place during August. Action 3: A tour of the changing facilities at Omagh Leisure Complex will take place at the next Omagh Access Advisory Group meeting in August. Action 4: A celebration event to recognise Omagh Leisure Complex's Disability Sports NI Award will take place at the next Omagh Access Advisory Group meeting in August.	
3.	Update: Disability Advisory Group/ Terms of Reference Margaret presented members with a list of the seven Councillors who will sit on the Disability Advisory Group over the next 4 years. Margaret gave an overview of the Terms of Reference for the two Access Advisory Groups and how the members can help advise on Council services. Margaret highlighted that the Council can act on areas or problems that are within its remit. Gerry K. emphasised that Councillors can learn a lot from the members as they have first-hand experience of the requirements needed to make things more accessible. Margaret encouraged members to take the opportunity to talk to Councillors and Officers about any concerns they have.	

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	Gerry M. queried whether the newly elected Councillors had been provided with training. Margaret highlighted that all Councillors are provided with a package of training that covers a broad range of topics, including information on the Councils work on Equality and Disability. Margaret explained that the Disability Advisory Group will need to nominate four members from each of the two Advisory Groups going forward. Action 5: Members to vote for four members to represent them at the next Access Advisory Group meeting. Margaret also suggested that the Groups create Action Plans for the next 2 years to help highlight areas that the Group can work on. All members agreed. Any Other Business: Doris explained that the Macular Degeneration Support Group has been struggling to find an organisation to help members learn computer and mobile phone skills. Anne K. highlighted that banks are providing training on how to use online banking. Pauline suggested contacting Fermanagh Rural Community Initiative to help source tutors for classes. Anne K. informed the group that Edinburgh has a scheme that provides public transport discount for people with disabilities. Margaret explained that while transport is not a Council power, Community Planning may be able to help investigate this option. Action 7: Margaret to pass query onto Community Planning. Gerry added that he had a great experience at Enniskillen Yacht Club through the SailAbility programme. Joanne also shared her positive experience. Insert Update: Action 7: Translink NI currently provide a half fare Smartpass for anyone who is in receipt of Personal Independence Payment, previously Disability Living Allowance. To be eligible to apply for this half fare concessionary travel pass you must be getting either the higher or lower rate mobility component.	
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	How to apply To get a SmartPass you must also be aged between 16 and 59, and have been permanently resident in Northern Ireland for a minimum of three months.	
	 You can get an application form: in person from any Translink bus or rail station by phoning 028 9066 6630 (deaf and hard-of-hearing applicants can use the textphone number 18001 9066 6630) by emailing: smartpass@translink.co.uk to ask for a form to be posted to you
