Brief Description	Fermanagh and Omagh Policing and Community Safety Partnership aims to create safer, shared communities. To help achieve this the Fermanagh and Omagh Policing and Community Safety Partnership (PCSP) has funding available to assist with the delivery of projects that respond to community
	needs and emerging trends. The funding will focus on projects which address an identified community safety need <b>AND/OR</b> build community confidence in policing.
	The PCSP invites organisations to submit a proposal for funding to deliver activity in the 2023-2024 financial year. By inviting the proposal, the PCSP is not making any commitment to funding the proposal wholly or in part.
	All project activity must take place in the Fermanagh and Omagh District Council area. Prior permission must be granted from the PCSP for project activity to take place outside of the Council area.  Applications will only be accepted from groups/organisations based in the Fermanagh and Omagh District Council area.
	Any future funding agreement between the PCSP and the organisation will be governed by a Letter of Offer (LoO).
	PCSP funding is subject to availability from the Joint Committee.
	Only one application per group/organisation can be submitted.
	Successful projects will be expected to complete and provide all monitoring and evaluation requirements in line with Outcomes Based Accountability (OBA) identifying how much you did, how well you did it and the change the project made to people's lives i.e. is anyone better off as a result.
	This programme has received financial support from the Department of Justice and the Northern Ireland Policing Board and is administered through Fermanagh and Omagh District Council.

# Programme Specific Criteria

The PCSP small grants programme supports organisations to address community safety issues e.g., anti-social behaviour, fear of crime, internet safety AND/OR build confidence in policing. Project activities will result in positive and measurable change in terms of community safety and levels of engagement with and community confidence in policing. Applications that are solely activity based e.g., trip to outdoor centre will not be considered. Where feasible project activity should take place within the Fermanagh and Omagh District Council area.

Fermanagh and Omagh PCSP is not obliged to accept any or all bids and reserves the right to fund successful applications in part or in full.

The project MUST proactively involve the local Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) in its delivery. If you are unsure who to speak to in your NPT please contact the PCSP and we will be happy to put you in touch with the relevant officer.

All expenditure must comply with FODC procurement guidelines.

Retrospective funding will NOT be considered. Successful groups must be in receipt of a Letter of Offer before they incur any project expenditure. It is very important that successful groups must carefully read and adhere to the terms and conditions of the Letter of Offer.

Projects involving activities or programmes for children and young people, must provide a copy of their Child Protection Policy to Fermanagh and Omagh District Council on request. It is the responsibility of the successful applicants to ensure that all those in engaged in project delivery where children and young people are involved have the correct level of current Access NI clearance.

## **Eligibility**

Applicant groups must be a not for profit constituted community or voluntary group with an annual AGM.

The following are eligible for funding:

- Workshop facilitator
- Venue hire
- Refreshments capped at 20% of the funding award
- Project materials
- Transport costs
- Diversionary activities
- Equipment where it can be demonstrated it is integral to the project activity

The following are NOT eligible for funding:

- Staff costs
- Running costs
- CCTV
- Prizes
- Consultancy
- Activities of a political or exclusively religious nature
