Background

Fermanagh and Omagh District Council has secured £2.6m to deliver a PEACE IV Local Action Plan for the district to promote positive relations between people from different backgrounds and communities. The programme is supported by the European Union's PEACE IV Programme, managed by the Special EU Programmes Body (SEUPB).

The PEACE IV Local Action Plan will support 15 programmes or initiatives across three key themes – Children and Young People; Shared Spaces and Services; and Building Positive Relations.

The Local Action Plan was developed following extensive consultation in 2016 with local communities to ensure actions address their needs and issues identified.

A voluntary PEACE IV Partnership - made up of Councillors and representatives from statutory agencies and social partners – will support and monitor the effective delivery of the Local Action Plan.

The PEACE IV Programme is an EU Funded Programme designed to support Peace and Reconciliation in Northern Ireland and the Border Region. It is managed by the Special EU Programmes Body (SEUPB). Matching-funding for this element of the PEACE IV Programme has been provided by the Executive Office in Northern Ireland and the Department of Housing, Planning, Community and Local Government in Ireland.

PEACE IV Youth Focused Shared Space Programme

Introduction

In its role as lead partner Fermanagh and Omagh District Council wishes to invite Expressions of Interest under the PEACE IV Youth Focused Shared Space Programme – a Capital Programme aimed at developing and enhancing areas or buildings in the district to become more youth focused.

Project Definition

It has been determined that at least 7 communities / areas within Fermanagh and Omagh will be engaged in the project. In the interests of geographical equity, one community / area from each District Electoral Area (DEA) will be selected. A number of additional projects may be held in reserve based on the assessment outcome.

For the purposes of this programme the definition of Youth/Young People will be young people within the 10-19 age range.

Research indicates that the majority of community halls are being utilised on a single identity basis.

The objective of the Youth Focused Shared Spaces Programme is to support the creation of a more cohesive society through an increased provision of shared spaces and services for the young people of the district.

The programme provides the opportunity for groups and organisations to develop and/or enhance areas or buildings to become more orientated and attractive to young people with the emphasis on sharing and access to all irrespective of community background. The aim is to ensure that such spaces are utilised by different communities on a sustained basis.

It should result in an increase in the percentage of people who would define the neighbourhood where they live as neutral; an increase in the percentage of people who prefer to live in a mixed religion environment; and a reduction in the percentage of people who would prefer to live in a neighbourhood with people of only their own religion.

PEACE IV: Youth Focused Shared Space Programme

Introduction

In its role as lead partner Fermanagh and Omagh District Council wishes to invite Expressions of Interest under the PEACE IV Youth Focused Shared Space Programme – a Capital Programme aimed at developing and enhancing areas or buildings in the district to become more youth focused.

Project Definition

It has been determined that at least 7 communities / areas within Fermanagh and Omagh will be engaged in the project. In the interests of geographical equity, one community / area from each District Electoral Area (DEA) will be selected. A number of additional projects may be held in reserve based on the assessment outcome.

For the purposes of this programme the definition of Youth/Young People will be young people within the 10-19 age range.

Only projects of a minimum capital value of £50,000 and a maximum capital value of £70,000 will be considered. A maximum 10% of the overall cost will be available for purchase of capital equipment.

Funding for recurrent or activity costs is not available within this programme.

Assistance will be provided to the selected projects to develop appropriate activity programmes and identify potential revenue streams to support these activities.

Conditions of Participation:

Successful groups and organisations will be required to:

- Enter into a development agreement to meet the conditions of the PEACE IV Programme as specified by SEUPB and the Council.
- Strive to achieve equal participation from the two main communities.

If you are interested in submitting an Expression of Interest the following 3 strand assessment approach will be applied:







Strand 1 Essential Criteria:

Expressions of Interest:

All groups/organisations must meet the essential criteria. Expressions of interest will be required to demonstrate that:

- The beneficiary group or organisation is:
 - Located within the Fermanagh and Omagh District Council Area
 - Operated on a 'Not for Profit' basis
 - o A constituted community/voluntary group or organisation
- The property/building/area to be developed is:
 - o Council owned or
 - Owned by the community/voluntary group/organisation or
 - Leased by the community/voluntary group or organisation and a lease agreement is in place for a minimum of 5 years.
 - The owner has provided consent for the proposed development.
- There is community support for:
 - o The capital works element of the project and the ongoing delivery plan.

Strand 2 Quality of the Project:

2a Quality of the Project (Capital Works):

(40%)

The quality assessment of the capital works will be based on such aspects as:

- The scale of the proposed development and does it represent value for money
- The impact on the existing facilities and other amenities available locally
- Supporting sustainable development it terms of environmental protection, personal wellbeing, social cohesion and inclusive governance
- The management of future operational, maintenance and replacement costs
- New / innovative approaches drawing on best practice







2b Quality of the Project (Activity Delivery Plan): (40%)

The quality assessment of the activity delivery plan will be based on such aspects as:

- Alignment with the Community Plan for the District and other plans/strategies for the area.
- Complementing previous and current peace and reconciliation focused activities
- Introducing new and innovative approaches drawing on best practice
- Improving cross-community relations and community cohesion
- Assisting young people to develop a greater understanding of diversity and access to new opportunities

Strand 3 Needs Based Assessment:

(20%)

Evidence of Need:

The Council will utilise quality assured statistics to develop an assessment of need for the Youth Focused Shared Space Programme. A full scoping study for this strand will be undertaken and will cover such aspects as:

- The proportion of young people in an area
- The needs of young people in the area
- Isolation from other areas / spaces / services
- Provision of space locally
- Evidence that there is potential for improved cross-community cohesion

Failure to provide the above information and incomplete expression of interest forms will result in the application being deemed ineligible.
