Key Recommendations

- **Under 16: Children and Young People**

Targeted engagement with children aged 16 (and even young children) will be a priority for the next round of engagement, as the engagement findings did not include this demographic adequately. It was felt that the next phase of the community plan development would present a more appropriate opportunity to engage with this section of the community when action plans are available to discuss and when engagement can be more tailored to meet the needs of younger people and children.

- **People of different Racial or Ethnic origin**

A small proportion of people from different racial or ethnic origins did engage including 7 Irish Travellers (from youth engagement targeted events) 1 person of mixed ethnic origin and 1 person of Indian ethnic origin in the community planning engagement throughout the process. This accounted for 2.2% of the 397 respondents who answered this question when completing the Equality Monitoring Form.
