

Enniskillen Electricity Network Upgrade

Northern Ireland Electricity Networks (NIE Networks) is the owner of the electricity transmission and distribution networks in Northern Ireland, transporting electricity to over 860,000 customers including homes and businesses.

Starting in early February, NIE Networks will be undertaking a £1 million programme of upgrade works to their infrastructure and systems in Enniskillen ahead of the Council starting the Enniskillen Public Realm Scheme later this year.

The work, which will replace the existing low voltage cable network within the Public Realm Scheme area, will start on Anne Street and work towards Forthill Road. Approximately 7km of mains cable will be laid with most of the underground cables located in the public footway and, where required, existing older services to individual premises will be replaced.

Gary Morton, Project Manager for NIE Networks, said:

"Our upcoming work in Enniskillen is a very important project in our plans to upgrade the electricity infrastructure throughout Northern Ireland. Reliability issues can occur with older electricity cables and parts of the network in the area are approximately 80 years old. Our £1 million investment will modernise the network and ensure we are delivering the highest level of service to our customers in Enniskillen.

"Our work will be carried out in six phases with work completed at each phase before moving to the next to help minimise disruption to businesses, traffic flow and members of the public." Further information about NIE Networks and the Enniskillen project can be found at www.nienetworks.co.uk

The Public Health Agency has provided funding to support Walking for Health Groups delivering walking programmes in the Western Trust area.

- Funding cannot be used to pay individuals to lead walks, as it is expected that trained walk
 leaders lead walks in a voluntary capacity or as part of their core work role in line with the
 Walking for Health Programme ethos.
