New shared history and peace building website application to be developed for Fermanagh and Omagh

Members of the public are invited to share their experiences and knowledge on how their communities work together to deliver peace-building initiatives as part of the development of a new website application.

The website application, which will document the shared history of The Troubles locally, will also showcase peace building initiatives and activities specific to the Fermanagh and Omagh area. This is one of 16 projects being delivered as part of the £2.8 million Fermanagh and Omagh PEACE IV Local Action Plan.

The Local Action Plan is being delivered by Fermanagh and Omagh District Council and is supported by the European Union's PEACE IV Programme, managed by the Special EU Programmes Body (SEUPB). Match-funding has been provided by the Executive Office in Northern Ireland and the Department for Rural and Community Development.

Information sessions on getting involved in the project will be held in the Connect Centre, 16 High Street, Omagh on **Tuesday 5 and 19 March** from 12 noon to 2.00pm and in Fermanagh House, Enniskillen on **Tuesday 12 and 26 March** from 1.00pm to 3.00pm.

A digital educational resource pack will be developed alongside the website application.

The website application and resource pack will provide an online archive of the shared history of The Troubles specific to the Fermanagh and Omagh area as well as highlighting cross community initiatives and best practice approaches that have contributed to sustaining a more peaceful society.

A networking group, to include members of the local community, will be established to guide the delivery of the project.



Not long after the UK referendum on Brexit, local photographer Ruth Gonsalves Moore returned to Fermanagh taking a job 'over the border', becoming one of an estimated 118,000 frontier workers undertaking daily north to south, south to north commutes.

The nothing-to-be-seen border has started to once again loom large and the car radio jams with worrying talk. However, during these journeys the personal has space to percolate and Ruth begins documenting her journeys 'from the inside and through the screen'. Letting the camera find its own focus, she considers what comes in and out of view in this between north and south place, where the local and the global co-exist or collide and everything (and nothing) is in-flux. Aware that as she presses the shutter her own projections mingle with what is being stirred in the landscape and political surrounds.

In her images she is inviting us to consider: What is coming into view? What are 'the personal journeys' being undertaken?

Images presented in this exhibition are a work-in-progress and have been made over the past 15 months by the artist.

This pop-up exhibition is one of a series of events and activities organised by the Arts Service of Fermanagh and Omagh District Council. This is part of the Council's on-going commitment to arts development and to artists.

Enniskillen Electricity Network Upgrade

Northern Ireland Electricity Networks (NIE Networks) is the owner of the electricity transmission and distribution networks in Northern Ireland, transporting electricity to over 860,000 customers including homes and businesses.

NIE Networks will be undertaking a £1 million programme of upgrade works to their infrastructure and systems in Enniskillen ahead of the Council starting the Enniskillen Public Realm Scheme later this year.

The work, which will replace the existing low voltage cable network within the Public Realm Scheme area, will start on Anne Street and work towards Forthill Road. Approximately 7km of mains cable will be laid with most of the underground cables located in the public footway and, where required, existing older services to individual premises will be replaced.

Gary Morton, Project Manager for NIE Networks, said:

"Our upcoming work in Enniskillen is a very important project in our plans to upgrade the electricity infrastructure throughout Northern Ireland. Reliability issues can occur with older electricity cables and parts of the network in the area are approximately 80 years old. Our £1 million investment will modernise the network and ensure we are delivering the highest level of service to our customers in Enniskillen.

"Our work will be carried out in six phases with work completed at each phase before moving to the next to help minimise disruption to businesses, traffic flow and members of the public." Further information about NIE Networks and the Enniskillen project can be found at www.nienetworks.co.uk

This decision has been driven by the increasing pressures on our service in terms of reduced funding from Government, and in order to ensure that we meet EU Drivers Working Hours Regulations, Fermanagh Community Transport Ltd will be reducing its Dial a Lift operating times.

Therapeutic groups for anxiety and depression

Walking Talking Making

A Nature Based Therapy Group for Anxiety and Depression Facilitators:

Robbie Breadon PhD – Psychotherapist, Fionnuala O'Neill – Artist and Art Therapist Trainee. The Walking-Talking-Making programme is designed to use each participant's creativity levels and joy of the outdoors to help improve mental health and general wellbeing. Taking time to talk within the group or individually with the facilitators will enhance the therapeutic benefits of being outdoors and creating art. A range of mindfulness techniques will also be included. The Spring 2019 programme is being offered to people with anxiety and depression. The group will meet every week for 10 weeks and will be led by a Psychotherapist and an Art Therapist Trainee. There is an extension to the programme, two participants will have the opportunity to experience a series of 1-1 sessions with Fionnuala in her role as the Art Therapist Trainee.

This group will run on Thursday mornings starting on Thursday 7 March, 10am - 1pm.

Horticulture Therapy for Anxiety and Depression

Robbie Breadon PhD – Psychotherapist

Anja Rosler - Community Gardener and Conservation Consultant

The Common Ground Horticulture Therapy programme is designed to use the activity of growing plants to help improve mental health and general wellbeing. Taking time to talk within the group or individually with the facilitators will enhance the therapeutic benefits of gardening. A range of mindfulness techniques will also be included. The Spring 2019 programme is being offered to people with anxiety and depression. The group will meet every week for 12 weeks and will be led by a psychotherapist and a community gardener. There is extensive published evidence to support the efficacy of Horticulture Therapy in helping to improve mental health. Previous participants at Common Ground have said that they love coming out to the farm and have reported lots of benefits over 12 weeks.

Common Ground has been running these groups since the spring of 2016. The groups are kept small so participants will have a lot of individual support. Activities are coordinated with the individuals' care team and/or family input.

The 2019 spring group is focused starts on Tuesday 5 March, 10am-1pm. It will be a 12 week program. More information is available via Horticulture Therapy for Anxiety and Depression. You can access the service using the referral link - Referral to Common Ground
