Tawakkol Karman turns 40 on 7th February and is a Yemeni journalist, politician and human rights activist leading the group "Women Journalists Without Chains" which she co-founded in 2005. She became the first Arab woman and the second Muslim woman to win a Nobel Prize as well as the second youngest Nobel Peace Laureate to date.

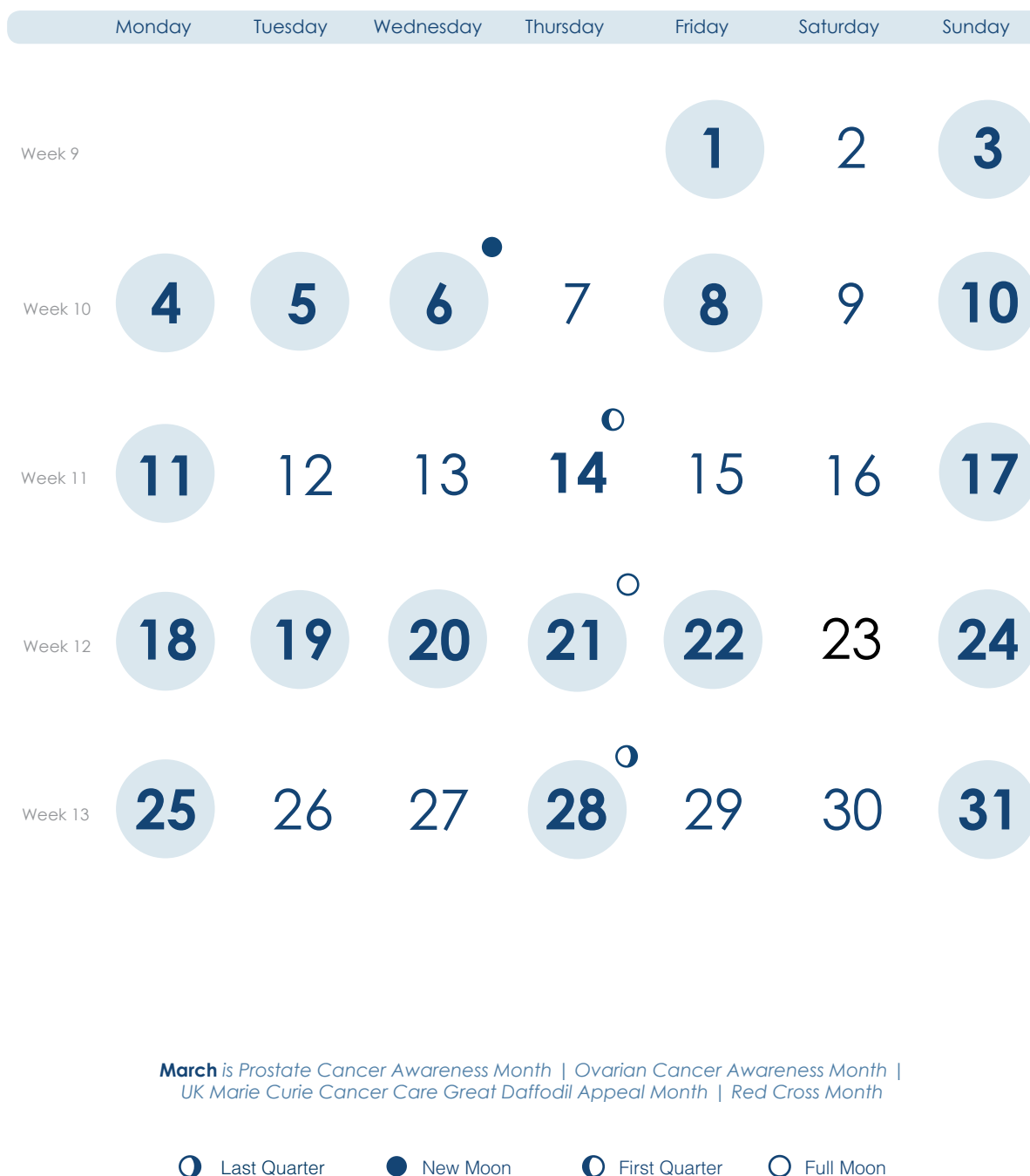
March 2019

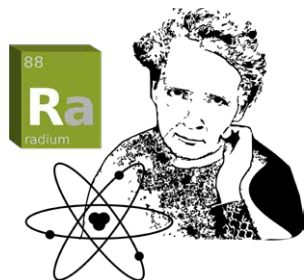

Marie Skłodowska Curie



4th July marks 85 years since the death of Marie Curie, a Polish and naturalized-French physicist and chemist who conducted pioneering research on radioactivity. She was the first woman to win a Nobel Prize, the first person and only woman to win twice and the only person to win a Nobel Prize in 2 different sciences.

I have frequently been questioned, especially by women, of how I could reconcile family life with a scientific career. Well, it has not been easy.

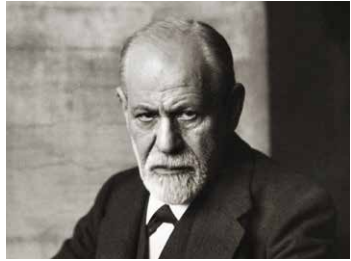

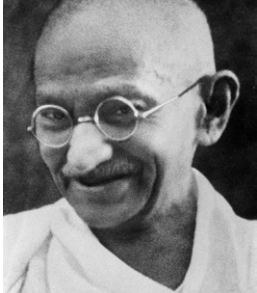

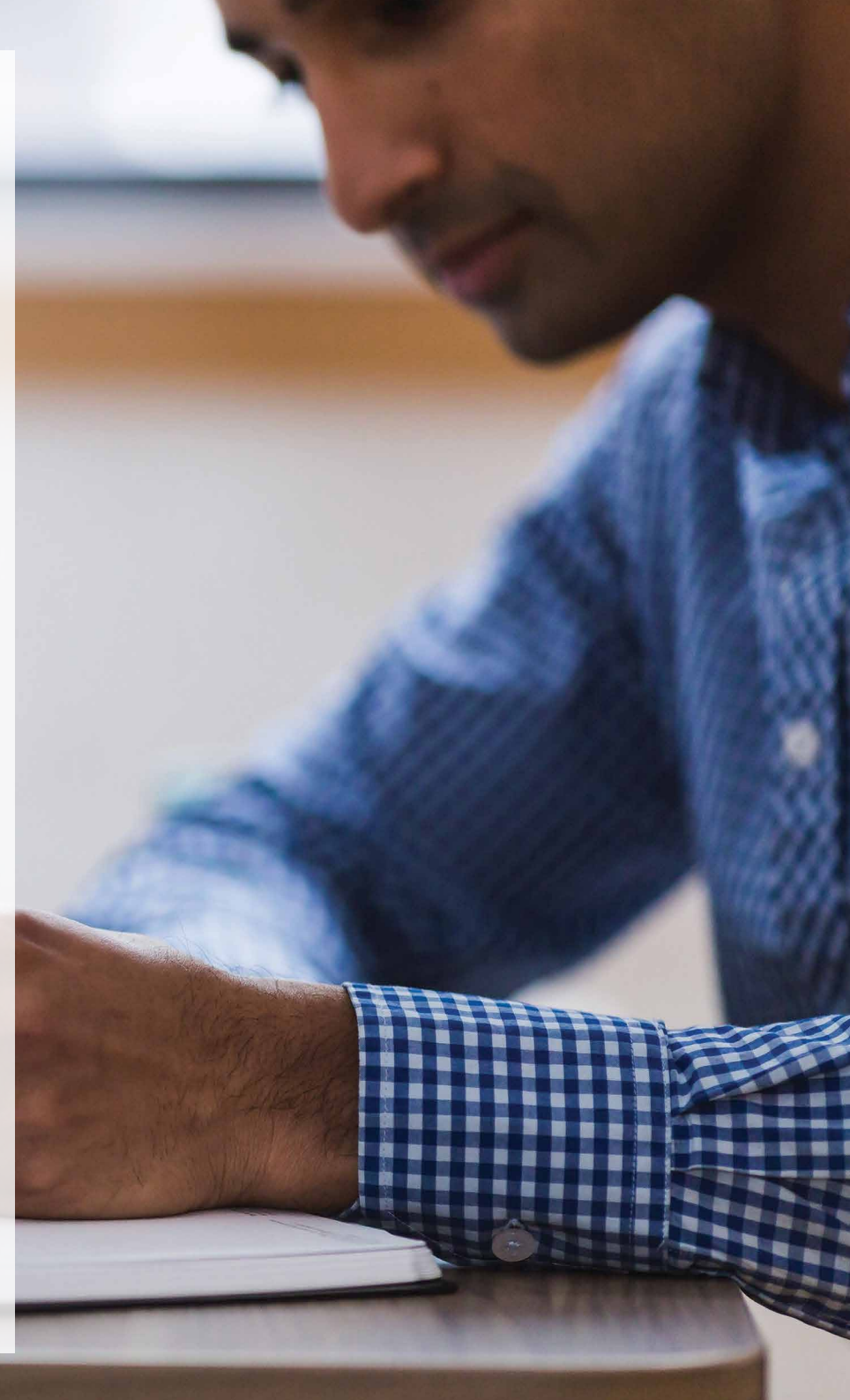
