



What is the Enniskillen **Neighbourhood Renewal** Partnership?

Neighbourhood Renewal brings together the work of Government Departments and Fermanagh and Omagh District Council in partnership with local people to improve the surroundings, services, well-being and access to opportunities for residents who live within the designated area. Locally, this is coordinated by the Enniskillen Neighbourhood Renewal Partnership.

The Partnership Board meet every other month to highlight new issues in the area and to identify solutions. The Partnership also has a number of Sub-Committees which meet every other month and are attended by people from a variety of services, agencies, community groups, elected representatives and local residents. It is important to remember that Neighbourhood Renewal is not just about funding. Many community improvements may require nothing more than discussion and a fresh set of ideas to help make a difference which is why attending

the Sub-Committee meetings is so important to local representatives and residents. Neighbourhood Renewal is delighted to welcome new members to join the Sub-Committees.

The Health Project

The Neighbourhood Renewal Investing in your Health Project supports residents to look after themselves and their communities and aims to enhance positive mental health and physical wellbeing, and to support the reduction of obesity, alcohol and drug use.

The Enniskillen Neighbourhood Renewal Health Project continues to work towards improving the health and wellbeing of those living in our communities. Specialist support and counselling sessions are offered which are provided through the Aisling Centre, Nexus NI and SOLACE. These services are essential to the lives of so many living in our Neighbourhood Renewal areas here in Enniskillen.

A collaboration event took place in Enniskillen which seen 207 people attend a Health, Education and Employment fair. This was a very well attended event and has received positive feedback from all who participated.

During this Health Fair, a number of health and wellbeing items were distributed including:

- Gym Passes / Family swim passes; and
- Health Checks

The Devenish Partnership Forum (DFP) have also been running a number of health activities including:

- Women's Health Fit (Chi-Mai)
- Crafty Men Group
- Resilience Class
- · Walking Groups; and
- Christmas Crafts

DFP also facilitated a very successful senior Citizens Christmas Party which was attended by almost 70 people from both the Devenish and Westend communities.

Further activities and programmes are scheduled for each Neighbourhood Renewal area. Programmes including Mindfulness, Introduction of CBT, Dance classes, Pilloxing and Drug & Alcohol Awareness programmes, Crochet/Knitting group, Boxercise, Mood Maters session, are all scheduled to take place over the coming months.

Homework and Activity Club

This Year there are 40 children attending the Homework and Activity Club.

Activities so far this year have been crafts, baking, cinema, clubbercise and Halloween Scaveneger hunt. As always activities are geared to provide the children with opportunities to have some well deserved break from homework.

Early Days

The Early Days Junior Homework Club currently has 24 children from Neighbourhood Renewal Areas attending on a regular basis. The Homework Club gives the children a chance to avail of resources they may not have at home. There is access to IPads to complete Maths, an extensive reading library for Accelerated Reading and all our Friday activities are curriculum based.

During the summer, the annual Summer Scheme ran for two weeks in July The activities included were Jonny Rockos, Cinema Trip, Core NI, Fermanagh Fun Farm, Airtastic along with some Arts and Crafts. The Summer Scheme was really successful and feedback from the children and their parents have all been really positive, with some already looking forward to next summer.

These activities and trips gave the children the opportunity to play with their friends and have some well-deserved time off homework, which is so important.

The children have the option to attend 5 days per week but they must attend a minimum of three to sustain their place in the Early Days Homework Club. Since September the children have participated in activities such as Polliwogs, Cinema Trip, Baking, Bush Craft, Jonny Rockos and much more.

The children also had their annual Halloween disco which they enjoy every year.

Little Foxes Playgroup, Kilmacormick opened for their new intake of children in September and in accordance with guidelines and the approval of Social Services they have continued to offer their service Monday -Friday based on the Eager & Able To Learn Programme. All 24 places have been filled. Little Foxes also ran through the month of July, all the children had great fun doing arts and crafts, sporting activities and great enjoyment from a day on bouncing castles.

The Committee raised funds for "The Big Bus" Action Cancer, to attend the West End Centre. The health checks included Breast Screening and a MOT Health Check. The Bus attended in December 22' and all appointments were fully booked.

The Partnership have worked extremely hard in getting the West End Community Centre thriving again and they encourage all members of the community to make use of the centre and what it has to offer. Neighbourhood Renewal provide the centre with a programme of activities organised for Neighbourhood Renewal residents to avail of, most of which are free of charge. The range of activities is designed to suit all age groups such as yoga, sensory play sessions, card making, arts and crafts, chair yoga, line dancing, step aerobics, Pilates, mindfulness and kids dance and drama to name a few.

A four week craft event has just finished at the West End Centre and as you can see, the residents created lots of festive and very beautiful crafts. The classes are a great way to take your mind off your worries and try a fun new skill. While crafting there is also the opportunity to improve hand-eye coordination, relax and lower stress and of course have a sense of achievement. The range of activities are achievable for all users and really helps nurture creativity. Engaging in creativity can help you feel more alive and definitely creates a great opportunity for socialising and having a laugh.

Enniskillen Going Places Programme

This project involves the dedicated services of the three mentors in a combined programme who work together as a team to cover all four neighbourhood Renewal areas across Enniskillen, Omagh, Dungannon and Coalisland.

The Going Places project has continued to act as a stepping stone for Neighbourhood Renewal Residents to access education, training or employment. Although it is recognised that there are a number of training courses available in the area, this project is funded to target and provide support to a specific group of people who, without the additional support of one to one mentoring, throughout their training period to ensure participants remain on the programme and focus on developing transferable skills required for the world of work.

The project continues to focus on level 2 and above training provision to avoid duplication with other training courses and meets an identified gap in these Neighbourhood Renewal areas.

Prior to the introduction of the Going Places project a lot of the current opportunities available were being specifically targeted at the under 25 age bracket. The Department for Communities Jobs & Benefits Offices have confirmed that this programme compliments existing college provision by providing access to education and training, as Neighbourhood Renewal Residents are currently under represented in College enrolments in each of the four Neighbourhood Renewal areas.

The following are direct quotes from participants on the programme reflecting impact of the programme in 2022/23

"I was unsure what I wanted to do, after meeting with the mentor, we looked at jobs and opportunities and decided to apply for the access to higher education course. This was daunting being out of education for so long, but having a mentor to meet weekly for support really does make all the difference".









Supporting Communities Update

Service Delivery

Supporting Communities staff are continuing to work from home but are allowed to visits groups as normal in their community hubs.

Supporting Communities is preparing questions about 'Intermediate Rent' through The Amp, our community survey series. We want to find out what you think about bringing in this new tenancy option for Northern Ireland.

'The Amp' is a new engagement tool from Supporting Communities which will enable residents all over Northern Ireland to contribute their thoughts on a range of housing and community-related topics.

'The Amp' aims to amplify the voice of residents in order to influence the decision-makers who can effect real change. We will use 'The Amp' to find out what matters to tenants and residents of all tenures and convey the results to regional governmental departments, local councils, and social landlords who will be able to use the data to better frame future community and housing policy and the delivery of improved services.

The Amp will publish surveys several times a year on topics of interest to communities and relay the findings to the people, organisations, and agencies that can benefit from this kind of grassroots polling.

As our database of Amp registrants grows, we will be able to offer more detailed information about the opinions and concerns of people sorted by type of tenure, council area, age, and other demographics.




