Context

December 2022: Implementation of the temporary suspension of Inpatient Emergency General Surgery at SWAH, following the decision by Trust Board. Ambulatory and elective General Surgery continues at SWAH.

January 2025: RQIA Review of the Pathways Associated with the Temporary Suspension of Emergency General Surgery at SWAH

May 2025: Encompass 'Go Live'

July 2025: Trust Board approved the decision to proceed with a 'Public Consultation on a permanent change to Emergency General Surgery' in July 2025

Health Minister asked the Trust to pause that consultation and begin the process of producing a **Vision Plan**, *'emphasising how the South West Acute Hospital will meet the health needs of its current and future population.'*

7 October 2025: Trust Board formally agreed to close the Public Consultation and start new work to design and develop a Vision Plan – a forward-looking programme focussing on the people and places of Fermanagh and West Tyrone.

Western Trust commitment to South West Acute Hospital


SWAH remains an important Acute Hospital within the Northern Ireland hospital network and its acute services provision has not changed. SWAH provides a 24/7 Type 1 Emergency Department, maternity services (Obstetrics and Gynaecology), full resuscitation facilities and Intensive Care Unit.

The Trust is also committed to contributing fully, where appropriate, to cross-border collaboration including, through partnership work already underway with Saolta and CAWT on cross-border issues.





Population Health: Broad scanning

Population Health: A Place-Based analysis for Western AIPB (Source: PHA)

PHA selected a small number of key indicators to look at per DEA to help Western AIPB focus on which DEAs to target with a geographical approach

Traffic light coded – dark red is “bad”, dark green is “good”

Number is the rank based on the 80 DEAs in NI

Indicators selected :

- Self reported health at census 2021
- Male Life Expectancy
- Potential years of Life Lost (PYLL)
- Std rate of potentially avoidable deaths
- Smoking related deaths
- Lung cancer incidence
- CHD registered patients
- Dementia registered patients
- Long term conditions in the NIMDM 2017



Fermanagh & West Tyrone: Health and Care Futures - Visioning approach

- **Outcome: A sequence of steps towards development of a vision plan**
 - Development of a Vision for Fermanagh and West Tyrone as a “People and Place” with SWAH integral to that work
- **Important dependencies:**
 - Identification of population health needs and future projections
 - Consideration of primary care and community care interfaces
 - Research evidence on the role of rural hospitals
 - DoH policy developments on Neighbourhood Model
 - Enhanced public engagement & involvement
- **Leadership:** Dedicated PMO to support the work on the Vision Plan with Service and SME support.
- **Timing:** Dependent on the approach and process - a careful and staged approach with high levels of engagement throughout.

Keeping GP Surgeries Open in Tyrone and Fermanagh

The Western Trust has intervened and taken action to support 3 GP practices in Fermanagh and West Tyrone that were at risk of closing and patients being dispersed to other GP Practices.

Almost 22,000 patients in this area would have dispersed to other GP Practices, meaning no local GP Practice access for those patients, if the Trust hadn't stepped in.
