(d) Be mated after 8 years old unless veterinary certification is granted		3
9 Change of ownership of a puppy		
A licence holder shall retain ownership & possession of a puppy until at least 8 wks		3

10 Identification of breeding bitches and other dogs		
(1) All breeding bitches & other dogs to be identified with a microchip. (exceptions)		3
(2) Where a breeding bitch / other dog arrives on any premises and has not been microchipped, the licence holder shall microchip the dog within 7 days.		3
11 Identification of puppies		
(1) The holder of a licence shall ensure that a puppy shall be identified with a microchip before it is 8 wks		3
12 Record keeping requirements		
The licence holder to maintain a record for each breeding bitch, puppy and retired dogs kept on the premises inc details of their sale.		3

Where only scores of 3 are recorded	• Issue licence. • One further inspection in-year.
