Introduction

On 1 April 2015, as a result of the Local Government Reform, Fermanagh and Omagh District Council was established to replace the former Fermanagh District and Omagh District Councils.

The aim of the reform programme is to create stronger, more efficient and more effective services. Fermanagh and Omagh District Council will be citizen focused, responding to the needs, aspirations and concerns of the local community.

The Council area is home to 116,289 people (as of the June 2019 population estimates). The District Council area is Northern Ireland's largest region in terms of land mass - approximately 3,000km², or 20% of NI - and the smallest in terms of population. As a result, the population density of approximately 41 people per km² is the sparsest in NI. This is a feature of the region which also provides specific challenges in relation to service delivery.

The Draft Corporate Sponsorship Policy aims to ensure the Council provides opportunities to support organisations/ event organisers for regional, national, international and signature events and festivals within the district that benefit the local area, the economy and attract visitors to the district.

The Policy also aims to maximise opportunities for the Council to obtain commercial sponsorship for appropriate events, activities, campaigns and facilities, whilst also offering potential sponsors attractive packages, offering value for all parties involved.

Purpose of this Consultation

The Draft Corporate Sponsorship Policy was ratified by Council in January 2020. The Policy has been designed to provide a consistent and transparent process to Sponsorship. The Policy has been developed to meet the strategic outcomes of Fermanagh and Omagh District Council's Corporate Plan 2020 – 2024 and the Fermanagh Omagh Community Plan 2030.

Outcome Area 1

The Council will make strategic investment decisions for local large and regional, national, international, signature events and festivals that will:

- increase attendance and participation in arts, cultural and heritage activities promoting creativity and wellbeing,
- Sporting events that increase participation and improve health and wellbeing outcomes may also be supported,
- Support events that provide economic benefits to the local economy, promote tourism and the visitor experience,
- Events were appropriate should enhance the natural environment, built and cultural heritage and be sustainability managed.

Outcome Area 2

The Council will develop sponsorship opportunities for socially responsible businesses and organisations wishing to Sponsor Council events, facilities or activities that will:

- deliver a consistent and transparent process for potential sponsors
- provide additional revenue streams for the Council
- ensure the Council works with businesses and organisations that are committed to paying the living wage

The Council recognises the important insights that our local citizens and organisations can provide to the Draft Corporate Sponsorship Policy and welcome responses.
