## Introduction

On 1 April 2015, as a result of Local Government Reform, Fermanagh and Omagh District Council was established to replace the former Fermanagh District and Omagh District Councils.

The Council area is home to 116,289 people (as of the June 2019 population estimates). The District Council area is Northern Ireland's largest region in terms of land mass - approximately 3,000km<sup>2</sup>, or 20% of NI - and the smallest in terms of population. As a result, the population density of approximately 39 people per km<sup>2</sup> is the sparsest in NI. This is a feature of the region which also provides specific challenges in relation to service delivery.

## Purpose of this Consultation

Fermanagh and Omagh District Council is currently consulting on the Ulster Scots Policy and is seeking feedback on the current draft.
