Introduction

On 1 April 2015, as a result of the Local Government Reform, Fermanagh and Omagh District Council was established to replace the former Fermanagh District and Omagh District Councils.

The Council area is home to 116,289 people (as of the June 2019 population estimates). The District Council area is Northern Ireland's largest region in terms of land mass - approximately 3,000km², or 20% of NI - and the smallest in terms of population. As a result, the population density of approximately 39 people per km² is the sparsest in NI. This is a feature of the region which also provides specific challenges in relation to service delivery.

Events & Festivals Strategy Purpose

Fermanagh and Omagh District Council is committed to ensuring our community and visitors have the opportunity to experience and participate in a range of quality and exciting events.

Fermanagh and Omagh District Council has acknowledged the importance of events and Festivals both to animate the community, to attract visitors and project positive images of the region and its capabilities, especially when events support and reinforce the product strengths of the area.

The Events and Festivals Strategy 2020-2025 defines Fermanagh and Omagh Council's role and ways it will support a program of events and festivals. It articulates the resource commitments Council will make and how FODC will work with the local community to ensure Events and Festivals are inclusive, demonstrate best practice, are sustainable and flourish. The aim is for the Strategy to be closely aligned to and integrate effectively with the key existing strategies across the Council area and being developed more widely. The strategy is supported with more detailed findings and research outcomes.

Purpose of this Consultation

The Council's draft Events and Festivals Strategy 2020-2025 was ratified by Elected Members in January 2020.

The Strategy has been developed to meet the strategic outcomes of Fermanagh and Omagh District Council's Corporate Plan 2020 – 2024 and the Fermanagh Omagh Community Plan 2030.

The draft Events and Festivals Strategy 2020-2025 has been designed to provide a framework to guide the Council's actions until March 2025.

The draft Events and Festivals Strategy 2020-2025 details five strategic goals and objectives. Each goal has particular areas of focus and a set of actions on how Fermanagh and Omagh District Council will address each of the strategic priorities to achieve the district's ambition for events and festivals.

The strategy five priorities are: (Action Plan)

1. Support

We will provide a supportive environment which facilitates the effective creation, production and development of existing events and festivals and attract new events and festivals that bring visitors and new spending to Fermanagh and Omagh.

2. Develop

We will develop strong collaboration across the public agencies with event / festival organisers identifying the resources required to build their capacity and capability and to support and assist events / festivals move towards being financially self-sustaining.

3. Promote

We will encourage, support and develop events that increase visitation and enhance the profile of the Fermanagh and Omagh District Council region as a destination that celebrates and showcases our communities, our people, places and unique selling points.

(Action Plan - Promote: 15-19)

4. Monitor

We will develop a consistent and systematic approach to event/ festival evaluation in order to measure the outcomes generated by those Fermanagh and Omagh District Council invests in. The evaluation framework should be used to assess the outcomes delivered by individual events, as well as the overall portfolio. (Action Plan - Monitor: 20-22)

5. Sustain

Fermanagh and Omagh District will be recognised as a leader in hosting environmentally and sustainable events and festivals.

(Action Plan - Sustain: 23)
