1. INTRODUCTION

The Consultation on Fermanagh and Omagh District Council's **Draft Performance Improvement Plan** for 2021/22 closed on **2 June 2021**. The Improvement Objectives and associated work strands consulted upon were:

Consultation responses could be submitted in writing (either by email, letter, or the online comment facility on the Council website – Performance Improvement page) or via the online survey. Social Media campaign analytics (sponsored content on Facebook and Instagram) indicate that a reach of **19,868** was achieved, with **379** post links. There were **523** Twitter impressions. There were **36** responses to the online survey. There were **4** response received via email. At the close of consultation, a total of **40** responses were received.

General		
(i) Reduce rates for domestic and commercial properties.		
(ii) A number of requests for road improvements/footway improvements.		
(iii) Provision of information in different formats such as easy read and braille. Greater publication of what is happening.		
(iv) Appoint Disability Champions.		
Waste and Recycling		
(i) Council should consider promoting a "Refuse, Repair, Reduce, Upcycle" strategy which minimises industrial production. This includes adhering to incoming UK		
legislation surrounding improved product design.		
(ii) The Council should support or pilot repair cafés and freecycle centres/working with Terracycle.		
(iii) We need greater transparency about recycling levels and where the goods end up.		
(iv) More public recycling bins, removable of black bins.		
(v) More bins around public jetties, promoting Fermanagh as a tourist attraction for boating holidays and water activities.		
(vi) Stricter enforcement of what is recycled needs to be implemented; should not have glass in recycling bins.		
Parks and Open Spaces		
(i) Preservation of already existing wild meadows, trees and hedgerows that occur naturally. More "No Mow May" wild meadows need to be mandated.		
(ii) A strict reduction in pesticides use on Council land e.g. grass roadside verges and fruit trees needs to be implemented.		
(iii) Greater fines and deterrents for people/organisations who destroy trees and hedges, especially during the nesting season. This involves implementing and		
enforcing existing legislation.		
(iv) Stricter litter and dog litter controls to maintain tranquillity at tourist and beauty spots.		
(v) Increase in public seating in towns for use by elderly.		
(vi) Increased funding for street cleansing to reduce weeds on footpaths.		
Building Control		
(i) Consider reducing/cutting parking prices.		
(ii) Consider if adequate town centre parking is available in Enniskillen.		
Planning		
(i) Agricultural buildings e.g. slatted roof houses, should be minimised and absolutely forbidden on hillsides or near streams and rivers. Land drainage should be		
discouraged in order to preserve natural wetlands.		
(ii) Less development in rural areas.		
(iii) Greater environmental controls.		
(iv) Council should consider the impacts of Fracking as it could put tourism in this area at risk.		
(v) Concern that Retail and Leisure parks will directly affect town centre economy.
