The application of the Policy should ensure all citizens are properly represented irrespective of them being rural or urban based.

The Council's Corporate Plan recognises all of the issues which impact on our rural residents and is working to identify new and innovative approaches to addressing these issues. The development of the Council's Corporate Plan, which is closely aligned to the Community Plan for the area, has taken account of the needs of people living in rural areas, within the context of the services which the Council has responsibility for. Beyond that, the plan also recognises the representative role of the Council in terms of lobbying others for improved service delivery to rural communities or changes in policy to more fully

		The plan commits to working in partnership with other service providers to improve local public service delivery and to working with the community and voluntary sector to address evidence-based need and to build capacity and volunteering levels within communities.

		The development of the Equality and Disability Action Plans has taken account of the needs of people living in rural areas, within the context of the services which the Council has responsibility for. Both Plans were revised to take account of the feedback received following a twelve-week consultation process.
		The plans commit to improve local council service delivery and to working with the community and voluntary sector to address evidence-based need, building capacity and volunteering levels within rural communities through opportunities to participate in Access and Inclusion Groups and work placements.

		Provision has been made to ensure that those living in rural areas are given opportunities to access the Irish language and will therefore not be negatively impacted due to living outside of urban areas.

The development of the Improvement Plan 2020-21 has been influenced by the needs of rural communities in that Fermanagh and Omagh District Council has made a commitment to invest in a range of environmental programmes, including waste reduction programmes, alongside working to improve levels of recycling; to increase uptake of Council provided leisure and recreation opportunities and improve provision of health promotion information to support citizens in making healthier choices; to deliver initiatives aimed at reducing disadvantage and supporting all of our citizens to achieve their potential through securing sustainable employment; and to invest in tourism products and experiences in order to attract increased visitor numbers and spend to our district.
Development of a Play Park Provision Plan for Fermanagh and Omagh District Council	Cross-cutting	The social and economic needs of people in rural areas have been identified by Fermanagh and Omagh District Council under the themes of: Access to services, Income, Employment and Health. Full details of the social and economic needs identified by the Council along with the issues considered in relation to these needs are documented in Appendix 3. The potential benefits of partnership arrangements with local schools and community facilities are highlighted when considering the development of new play spaces, including the opportunity to ensure effective site supervision and appropriate locations within the heart of the community which act as a focal point for families. The development of a Play Park Provision Plan for the District aims to ensure that people living in rural areas have access to open space and play areas for the adequate development, health and wellbeing of children and young people, regardless of their physical or mental abilities. The Plan recognises that play spaces have the potential to increase the opportunity for children and young people to connect with and be part of the community, especially where play facilities are provided in areas which are

		open and accessible to everyone. The Plan has been the subject of widespread consultation and the Council is keen to work with the Community and Voluntary Sector to address evidence-based need.

Full details of the social and economic needs identified by the Council along with the issues considered in relation to these needs are documented in Appendix 3. The Fermanagh and Omagh District Council area is a predominantly rural district with the exception, of the two main towns of Enniskillen and Omagh. Approximately 70% of the population live in rural areas outside the two main towns. As such all projects or initiatives planned for the District are mindful to ensure that the needs of residents in both urban and rural areas are met.
